Meditate & Memorize April 2023: Psalm 34 Come: He is good

Psalm 34 (NASB 1995)

I will bless the Lord at all times: His praise shall continually be in my mouth. ² My soul will make its boast in the Lord; The humble will hear it and rejoice. ³O magnify the Lord with me, And let us exalt His name together. ⁴ I sought the Lord, and He answered me, And delivered me from all my fears. ⁵ They looked to Him and were radiant, And their faces will never be ashamed. ⁶ This poor man cried, and the Lord heard him And saved him out of all his troubles. ⁷ The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear Him, And rescues them. ⁸O taste and see that the Lord is good; How blessed is the man who takes refuge in Him! ⁹O fear the Lord, you His saints; For to those who fear Him there is no want.

¹⁰ The young lions do lack and suffer hunger; But they who seek the Lord shall not be in want of any good thing. ¹¹Come, you children, listen to me; I will teach you the fear of the Lord. ¹² Who is the man who desires life And loves *length of* days that he may see good? ¹³ Keep your tongue from evil And your lips from speaking deceit. ¹⁴ Depart from evil and do good; Seek peace and pursue it. ¹⁵ The eyes of the Lord are toward the righteous And His ears are *open* to their cry. ¹⁶ The face of the Lord is against evildoers, To cut off the memory of them from the earth. ¹⁷ *The righteous* cry, and the Lord hears And delivers them out of all their troubles. ¹⁸ The Lord is near to the brokenhearted And saves those who are crushed in spirit. ¹⁹ Many are the afflictions of the righteous, But the Lord delivers him out of them all. ²⁰ He keeps all his bones, Not one of them is broken. ²¹ Evil shall slay the wicked.

And those who hate the righteous will be acondemned.

²² The Lord redeems the soul of His servants,

And none of those who take refuge in Him will be acondemned.

Study Guide:

Before you begin, still yourself before the Lord and pray that God would grant you eyes to see and a heart and mind ready to learn all that He wants to show and teach you. Then, take a few moments to read over the whole Psalm a couple of times before you begin. Mark it up. Notice repeated words/phrases, mark warnings, promises, blessings and the like. Discover and note attributes of God, comparisons, contrasts, and commands. Prepare to be blessed as you spend time with God in His word, such time is never wasted. Enjoy!

Verses 3, 8 and 9 begin with "0/0h" and the psalmist invites readers to join him. What are the three actions he proposes?
