

## Real Refreshment – The Podcast: Mark Study Guide

### Mark 16:1-20 → Resurrection of the Servant

Begin by praying that God's Spirit will bless your time in His word, that He will teach you His truth, that He will meet you right where you are today as you seek Him. Next, read through the whole passage slowly. Try to step into the passage remembering that Mark is recounting real events as Peter told him.

#### Passage breakdown:

##### Mark 16:1-13

- What does the passage mention is now over?
- Who heads to the tomb?
- What did they bring?
- Why?
- When did they go?
- What concern did they discuss?
- What did they see when they arrived?
- Why was this odd?
- Where did they go?
- What did they see there?
- What did he say to them?
- What directive were they given?
- Which specific disciple was mentioned?
- Where were they told Jesus had gone?
- How did the women respond?
- Who did Jesus appear to first?
- What had He already done for her?
- Who did she tell?
- How did they respond to what she told them?
- Who did Jesus next appear to?
- Who did they tell about their interaction with the risen Christ?
- How did the disciples respond to them?

For further study see: Matthew 28:1-15 and Luke 24:1-35 and John 20:1-18 noting the similarities and differences and remembering the different perspectives of the authors. Note also that the Luke passage contains the recounting of the "two" here in Mark 16:12.

##### Mark 16:14-20

- After these appearances, to whom did Jesus show himself?
- What were they doing at the time?
- For what did Jesus confront them?
- What then did Jesus tell His disciples to do?
- Specifically, where did He tell them to go?

What were they to do where they went?  
What were to be the actions of those saved?  
What would be the sign of condemnation?  
What would signs accompany them?  
After He said these things to them, what happened to Jesus?  
What did He do there?  
What did His disciples do?

For further study see: Matthew 28:16-20 and Luke 24:36-53 and John 20:19-21:25 noting the similarities and differences and remembering the different perspectives of the authors.

Interestingly there are no “immediately” verses in this week’s passage.

Take some time to read back over the passage and your notes. Are there parts of this passage that stand out to you? Pray that God will continue to teach you as you meditate on His word, the story of His Son, Jesus.

Consider this:

What do you believe about the resurrection of Jesus?  
Why is it significant?  
What does it represent in your own life?  
How do you live differently because of it?  
Who have you told about the Lord’s resurrection?  
How have they responded?  
How can you continue to pray for those who need to know about the resurrection?  
Do you know how to tell others about Jesus?  
When have you last shared your testimony of His life and death, His love?  
Who would you like to tell about Jesus?  
Will you determine to pray for the courage to tell?  
What other actions is the Lord asking you to take in light of these truths in Mark’s gospel?
